 - Open entries are \$1 per class. 16 years and under competitors are welcome to enter open classes, but must pay the \$1 per entry fee for open classes.
 - Entry to 16 years and under classes is free
- Exhibitor tickets will be emailed to you upon entry. **Please print out and attach these to the front of your exhibit upon delivery.**

DELIVERY AND JUDGING OF EXHIBITS

- Exhibits are to be delivered on **Saturday 25th October between 10am and 12 noon.**
- Delivery is to the Pavilion, Bungendore Showground, 71 Mathews Lane, Bungendore NSW.
- Judging to occur at 1pm on Saturday 25th October. Judging is closed to exhibitors and to the public.

EXHIBITION AND COLLECTION OF EXHIBITS

- The Pavilion will open at 9.00 am Sunday 26th October to Show patrons.
- All entries to be collected between **4pm and 5pm** on the day of the show. Entries will not be released earlier.
- Stewards cannot take any responsibility for exhibits after 5pm. **Items not collected by 5pm will be disposed of at the close of the show.**

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- Each exhibit
 - is to be the work of the entrant only
 - may be entered in one class only.
 - shall not bear a distinguishing mark that would reveal the identity of the entrant.
 - is NOT to have been shown in a previous Bungendore Show, with the exception of potted plants.
- Unless otherwise stated, no exhibit is to be more than 2 years old, except:
 - Section B Flowers, where exhibits can be more than 2 years old
 - Section G Photography, photographs must have been taken in the last 12 months.
- For 16 years and under classes,
 - Entrants may only enter in their own age groups
 - The age of the exhibitor must align with the age group entered.
For example, if the exhibit was made when an exhibitor was aged 12, but the exhibitor is now aged 13, then the exhibit must be entered in the 13 years class.
- Junior competitors can enter the novice and open classes, but must pay the entry fee.
- Entries that do not comply with rules as set out in the Pavilion Schedule will be marked NAS (Not According to Schedule) and will not be judged.
- Stewards have the right and final decision to place entries into a class other than that nominated by the entrant if there is a more suitable class available.
- The Show Society reserves the right to not display exhibits due to space constraints.
- While all care will be taken, the Bungendore Show is not liable or responsible for any damage to or loss of exhibits.
- Bungendore Show Pavilion is primarily an amateur competition. If you are a professional, i.e. you hold a qualification in and/or make money from or have ever made money from your craft, please enter the professional sections. Any additional rules for a specific section are outlined in that part of the schedule.
- Prize cards only awarded in all sections unless stated otherwise in the schedule.
- Prize money that is uncollected at the Exhibition Collection time will be held for one week before it becomes the property of the Show Society.
- When judging each class, judges can use their discretion to award 1st, 2nd, 3rd and Highly Commended prizes. They may choose more than 1 entry for each prize, or not award a prize.
- The Most Successful Exhibitor calculation shall be done as follows:
 - Each 1st prize to count as 3 points; 2nd as 2 points and 3rd as 1 point.
 - The Exhibitor gaining the highest number of points will be the winner.
 - In the event of two or more Exhibitors gaining an equal number of points, the Exhibitor gaining the greatest number of first places will be the winner.
 - Should a tie still occur, the second and third prizes will be taken into consideration.

THE AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES COUNCIL OF NSW (ASC)

RICH FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION

The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants of Class 1224

INGREDIENTS:

250g sultanas	1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
250 g chopped raisins	1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
250 g currants	250g butter
125 g chopped mixed peel	250g soft brown sugar
90 g chopped red glace cherries	½ teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated
90 g chopped blanched almonds	lemon rind
1/3 cup sherry or brandy	½ teaspoon almond essence
250 g plain flour	½ teaspoon vanilla essence
60 g self-raising flour	4 large eggs.
1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg	

RECOMMENDED METHOD:

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared **square 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8") tin** and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

NOTE: To ensure uniformity, and depending upon their size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4 – 6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3 – 4 pieces.

Judge Note: The height of the cake should not exceed 5.7cm (57mm)

Competition Process:

1. The NSW Rich Fruit Cake Competition is conducted in three stages:
 - a. Local competitions conducted under these regulations, held at Agricultural Shows affiliated with the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW.
 - b. Winners receive the specified prize and are eligible to enter the second stage of the competition.
2. Group Finals are conducted in each of the 14 regional groups of AgShows NSW where at least two eligible entrants have won a local competition in the current year. Entry is only open to eligible winners of local competitions. Entry is free.
 - a. Eligible entrants are required to bake a second Rich Fruit Cake to compete in the Group Final.
 - b. Winners receive the specified prize and are eligible to enter the third or final stage of the competition.

- c. If there is only one eligible entrant in a group, they will be automatically appointed Group finalist without having to present a second cake and will proceed to the State Final.
- 3. NSW State Final is to be held at the Sydney Royal Easter Show annually. Entry is open only to the Group finalists from regional competitions. Entry is free.
 - a. Group Finalists are required to bake a third Rich Fruit Cake to compete in the NSW State Final.
 - b. Winners receive the specified prize and are presented the AgShows NSW Plaque
